If you work a DX station you probably want that station's QSL card. An easy way to get it is to use the ARRL QSL Service. It's easy, and even better, it's free! You do NOT need to be an ARRL member to participate. Just follow a few simple instructions.

For complete details, go to the ARRL website, www.arrl.org. Click the "On the Air" tab, and select "QSL Service." Then select "Incoming QSL Service." Scroll down to the numbered area for

your call sign, which for most Treasure Coast folks is the fourth call area.

The 4-land QSL Bureau is divided into two sections. The first is for calls with one letter in the prefix (ex: W4, K4, N4, etc.); and the second for calls with two letters in the prefix (ex: WA4, KA4, AB4, KN4, etc.).

Single letter 4-prefix QSL cards process thru the Carolina DX Assn, manager W3GQ, contact sturpe@gmail.com. Two letter 4-prefix cards process via the Sterling Park ARC Bureau, manager W2YE, contact rwmaylott@aol.com.

The QSL service is free of charge. All it costs you are some "forever" Stamps and some 6"x9" SASE (selfaddressed to you). When a DX station sends his card to you via "the bureau," eventually it arrives at one of the above two clubs where it is processed and sent onward to you - provided you have supplied envelopes and postage in advance.

The QSL Bureau is a free service provided by dedicated DX hams like Bob ,W7MAE and his XYL Martha, W7KOY, who sort arriving QSL cards in their shack, and send them onward to their destinations.

Bob and Martha sort on average 5,000 to 6,000 QSL cards a year in their Port St. Lucie residence.


