

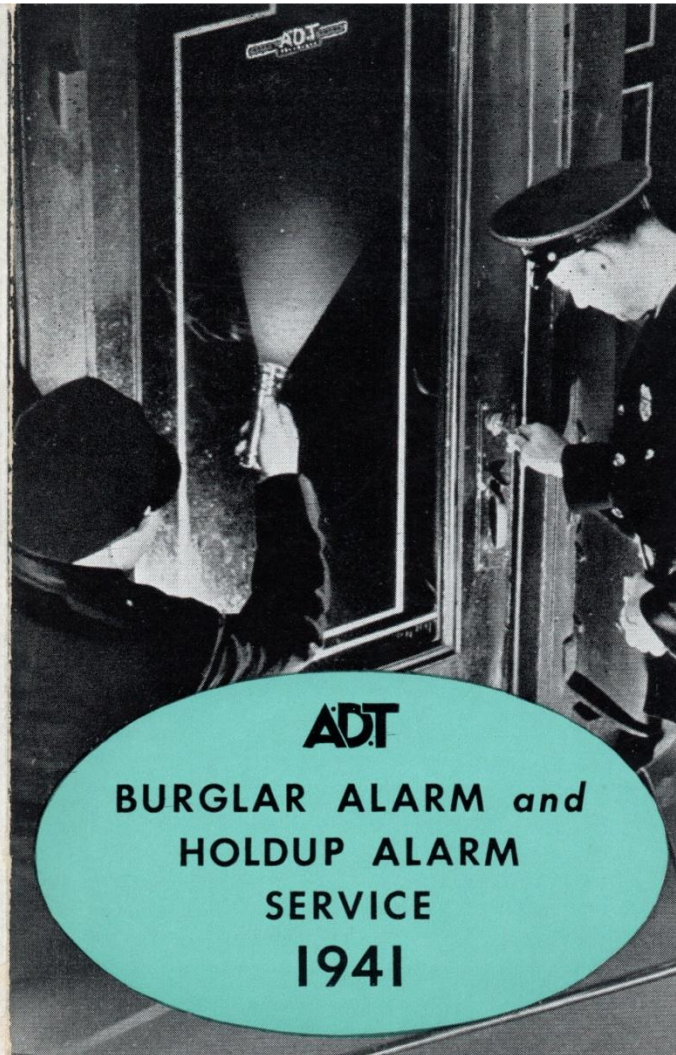

99.989% IMMUNITY
FROM BURGLARY LOSS

During 1941, alarms from A. D. T. burglar and holdup protection systems (including Invisible Ray systems for sabotage protection) resulted in a total of 356 captures, as follows:

- Captures resulting from burglar alarms 294
- Captures resulting from holdup and other emergency alarms 62

In addition to the above, 591 alarms resulted from causes other than unlawful attacks, as follows:

- Firemen forcing entrances in performance of duty 142
- Policemen or others trying doors that that were left unlocked 449

While the record of captures made is impressive evidence of the speed and efficiency of the police and A. D. T. guards in responding to alarms, captures are only incidental to loss prevention, the main objective of A. D. T. Protection. The effectiveness of the services in preventing losses is shown by the opposite page.

Putting burglars out of circulation is a service to the community in which A. D. T. is proud to have so important a part. However, the primary object of A. D. T. Service is to protect the property of its subscribers against loss. The following figures are convincing evidence of the effectiveness of A. D. T. Protection in accomplishing its designed purpose:

Total insurable values protected by A. D. T. Burglar Alarm Service **\$578,820,000***

During 1941, losses in attacks on A. D. T. Protection, in relation to insurable values protected, were **5/1,000ths of 1%**

Over the past ten years, this percentage has averaged 11/1,000ths of 1%, which represents an immunity from burglary loss of **99.989%**

* (This figure does not include the values in A. D. T. protected bank vaults, the U. S. Treasury, 32 Federal Reserve banks and branches, the U. S. Mints, or the bullion depositories at Fort Knox and West Point, all of which are A. D. T. protected.)
